Conserving our Water Resources

The Fulton County Department of Public Works would like to thank each student who participated in our annual Art Calendar Contest. In 2017, Fulton County and the Metro Atlanta area spent 8 months of the calendar year in a Level 2 drought response. This drought level response was put in place because of lower than average amounts of rainfall in our region as well as unseasonably warm temperatures leading into the summer season. The importance of conserving precious water resources is clear during times of drought; however, we should always make water conservation an essential part of our daily practices. Having a proactive approach to fixing leaks in homes and businesses, turning off faucets during routine daily tasks, watering our lawns during cooler times of the day, and properly disposing of fats, oils, and greases (FOG) are some small changes that produce big impacts. Changes such as these will also help protect our natural resources and the Chattahoochee River ecosystem by not using more water than we actually need. We hope the artwork in this calendar, created by our own Fulton County students, will serve as your inspiration to conserve water throughout this coming year and for years to come.
